Friday started with a visit to the Kandos Museum which started life as a Methodist Church which was the first church in Kandos. Much of Sydney's Infrastructure including the Sydney Harbour Bridge was built using Kandos Cement. Then it was time for lunch a short 7km back to Rylstone where we had lunch at the Globe Hotel in their sample room. This Hotel was built in 1880 a Sandstone Hotel of 12 rooms. The sample room was constructed in those days for commercial travellers to display their wares. It is now used as the Restaurant area. There was a wood fire making it very cosy. The food & company were excellent.

Saturday started with the local Mudgee Markets, a short walk from the Caravan Park. Reports were the Bacon & Egg Rolls with special homemade relish were to die for. Thanks to Chris & Ian after lunch we visited Pieter van Gent, another winery close by, where we sampled some of their wine as well as their Port Collection.

Monday time for lunch we headed to Kelly's Irish Pub formally "The Mudgee", "The Waratah" & the "Sydney Hotel" & before that it was Lamont's General Store. We were joined by Carline & Ernie.

Tuesday started with the sun shining ready for a great day to have Fish & Chips for lunch at the Caravan Park, orders were taken to the local Fish & Chip shop. After lunch, a quick visit to Putta Bucca Wetlands. This is a recreational area for bird watching, bicycle riding, walking & fishing.
