Gilgandra is famous for the number of windmills, some 360 were dotted across the landscape to tap into the underground water. In 1966 this changed to central water being supplied.

Gilgandra often called "Gil" is well known for the Coo-ee walk, in 1915 25 men left Gil to walk to Sydney for recruits for World War I. This walk was over 545 kilometres, when they reached Sydney there were 263 Men walking.

There is a great walk (along the river) from Town to the Cooee Centre (information centre) which is just under two kilometres. This walk highlights a number of windmills all painted different colours, each having their own sign which gives a brief history on each windmill.

Gilgandra is the cross roads of three highways, Newel, Castlereagh

and Oxley. This helps explain the number of trucks which pass through the town.

Gilgandra has a population of 4295 people.
Castlereagh River is sometimes called the
Upside Down River as most of the water
flows under the sand. Gil is also the
gateway to the Warrumbungle National Park.

We had 11 vehicles attend the get together with most arriving on Monday 24th April prior to Anzac Day. This get together seemed to run Monday to Sunday as seven vehicles left by the following Monday.

About 1pm we all enjoyed our Sausage Sizzle.














Rally Wrap Up - April 26 - May 3rd 2023



four vehicles left but being the 1st of May, the park lit the firepit which was great for happy hour, drinks and chats around the fire.




